

## THE ROLE OF MOTIVATION IN FOREIGN LANGUAGE LEARNING

### Introduction

Motivation is one of the most important factors influencing foreign language learning. Without motivation, students may lose interest and fail to achieve their learning goals. The aim of this paper is to analyze the role of motivation in language learning and identify effective ways to increase students' motivation.

### Main Part

Motivation in foreign language learning is generally divided into two main types: intrinsic and extrinsic motivation. Intrinsic motivation refers to learning driven by personal interest, enjoyment, or curiosity. For example, students who enjoy watching movies or listening to music in English often develop intrinsic motivation. This type of motivation is considered more effective because it leads to long-term engagement and deeper learning (Deci & Ryan, 1985).

Extrinsic motivation, on the other hand, is influenced by external factors such as grades, rewards, or social recognition. Students may study a language to pass exams, meet institutional requirements, or gain recognition from others. Although extrinsic motivation can effectively initiate learning behavior, it often does not sustain long-term engagement unless it becomes internalized (Dörnyei, 2001). Therefore, researchers emphasize the importance of maintaining a balance between intrinsic and extrinsic motivation to ensure both immediate effort and lasting commitment to language learning.

### **Factors Affecting Motivation**

Several factors influence students' motivation in learning a foreign language acquisition. These include:

- **Teacher's role** – supportive and enthusiastic teachers can inspire students
- **Learning environment** – a positive and interactive classroom increases motivation
- **Teaching methods** – modern and student-centered approaches are more motivating
- **Learner's goals** – clear personal goals increase determination

One of most important factors is teacher's role. Enthusiastic, supportive, and well-prepared teachers can inspire students and create a positive emotional atmosphere in the classroom (Harmer, 2007).

### **Impact of Motivation on Academic Achievement**

Motivation has a direct impact on students' academic performance. Highly motivated learners tend to spend more time practicing the language, participate actively in discussions, and demonstrate greater resilience when facing difficulties. They are more likely to use effective learning strategies and seek additional opportunities for practice (Dörnyei, 2001).

On the other hand, learners with low motivation often exhibit limited participation, poor attendance, and minimal engagement with learning tasks. Research consistently identifies motivation as one of the strongest predictors of success in second language acquisition (Gardner, 1985).

### **Strategies to Enhance Motivation**

Teachers play a central role in fostering and sustaining student motivation. One effective strategy is the use of interactive activities such as group work, discussions, and role plays, which encourage active participation and collaboration. These activities help create a dynamic learning environment that keeps students engaged (Harmer, 2007).

Another important approach is the integration of technology. The use of videos, mobile applications, and online learning platforms can make lessons more engaging and relevant to learners' lives. Additionally, providing positive and constructive feedback enhances students' confidence and encourages continued effort (Dörnyei, 2001).

Connecting classroom learning to real-life situations is also essential. When students understand the practical value of language skills—such as communicating in authentic contexts or using real-world materials—they are more likely to stay motivated and committed to learning.

### **The Role of Self-Motivation**

In addition to external support, self-motivation plays a vital role in successful language learning. Learners who take responsibility for their own progress are more likely to set clear goals, monitor their development, and actively seek opportunities to

practice the language. According to Deci and Ryan (1985), autonomous learners who internalize their motivation demonstrate greater persistence and achievement.

Developing self-discipline, maintaining a positive attitude, and fostering a sense of autonomy are essential for long-term success in foreign language learning.

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
