

THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN SCHOOL DISCIPLINE AND STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

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Abstract. Annotatsiya. Maktab intizomi o'quvchilarning akademik yutuqlari va ta'lim muhitining samaradorligiga ta'sir qiluvchi muhim omillardan biri hisoblanadi. Ushbu maqola maktab intizomi va o'quvchilarning o'qishdagi natijalari o'rtasidagi bog'liqlikni tahlil qiladi hamda tartibli qoidalar, samarali sinf boshqaruvi va o'qituvchi hamda o'quvchi o'rtasidagi ijobiy munosabatlar akademik muvaffaqiyatga qanday ta'sir ko'rsatishini ko'rib chiqadi. Shuningdek, maqolada intizomning yetarli darajada bo'lmasligi natijasida o'quvchilarning darslarga qiziqishi pasayishi va akademik natijalarning yomonlashishi kabi salbiy oqibatlar ham yoritiladi. Zamonaviy yondashuvlar sifatida ijobiy intizom, o'zaro hurmat va o'quvchilarda o'z-o'zini nazorat qilish ko'nikmalarini shakllantirish masalalariga alohida e'tibor qaratiladi. Tadqiqot natijalari samarali intizom tizimi o'quvchilarning nafaqat akademik natijalarini, balki shaxsiy rivojlanishini ham yaxshilashini ko'rsatadi.

Discussion

Strategies for Improving School Discipline

2. **Promote Positive Discipline:** Instead of relying solely on punishment, schools should use positive reinforcement to encourage good behavior. Recognizing and rewarding responsible actions helps students develop self-discipline and motivation (Bear, 2010; Lewis, Romi, Qui, & Katz, 2005).
3. **Effective Classroom Management:** Teachers play a central role in maintaining discipline. Organizing lessons well, maintaining order, and establishing respectful teacher-student relationships create an environment conducive to learning (Wang, Haertel, & Walberg, 1993).

4. Encourage Student Participation: Involving students in setting classroom rules and responsibilities increases their sense of ownership and accountability. When students understand why rules exist, they are more likely to follow them (Gregory et al., 2010).

Conclusion
