Example: "To'ylaringiz muborak bo'lsin! Hayotingiz faqat baxt, tinchlik va muhabbatga to'la bo'lsin!" (Congratulations on your wedding! May your life be filled with happiness, peace, and love.)

3. Academic Achievements (Akademik yutuqlar)

This form of congratulation acknowledges not only the achievement but also the journey that lies ahead, reflecting the importance of continuous personal development.

4. Birth of a Child (Chaqaloq tug'ilishi)
